

### 1st GRADE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

A new look 1<sup>st</sup> grade side stepped up to the mark this year with no less than 5 new faces, being Nick Sewell, Cameron Wood, Adam O'Sullivan, Steve Chapman and Andrew Byrne.

The team had an exciting start to the season. We were unbeaten in 10 outings and played Ex-Services in the one day final. Ex-Services won the toss and elected to bat first. With some tight bowling from Wood & Schaefer and a wicket off Curry's first ball, Ex-Services were always going to be in trouble. After 35 overs, Ex-Services could only manage 123. Curry claimed 3-23 off his eight, while Kingy took 2 wickets in the last over to finish with 4-11 from 4.5 overs to be on a hat trick for the first ball of next year's competition. After losing Sewelly for 0 in the 4th over, Schaefer in the 5<sup>th</sup> for 9 and a yes/no/sorry call (Byrne - 0) in the 9<sup>th</sup>, Hillgrove were 3-25. A classy knock from newcomer O'Sullivan (34), an unbeaten 55 from Kingy and Christian Buggy (5 no) saw the mighty Grove home for consecutive One Day Grand Final wins. Some performances of note during the One Day Comp were O'Sullivan 4-10 (YCW), Sewell 59 (Ex-Services), Bugsy 43 no (Ex-Services), Byrne 52 (Churches), David Farmer 42 (Easts), Schaefer 5-11 of 7.1 (YCW), Sewell 43 (Ex -Services), O'Sullivan 111 (Norths Waratahs 2), and Sewell 3-8 in the dark against Norths Waratahs 2.

After 11 wins on the trot in the one-day comp, we moved into the 2 day competition. After another 2 wins to begin with, we were bought back to earth with a thud by Ex-Services. Ex-Services scored 223 after being 7-150 with O'Sullivan bowling well to take 5-40 off 12 overs. In reply, we could only manage a meager 134, with only 3 batsman making double figures - King (36), Byrne (24) & Whackett (38). To make a positive out of a negative, we sent Servies back in for a second dig and to our credit we bowled them out the second time for 157 in 34 overs. Good job guys.

The next match was against Easts and it was reduced to a one day match at Wicklow. After being sent in we batted out our 40 overs scoring 132. O'Sullivan top scored with 40. After a good start by Easts (1-40 after 15 overs), we clawed our way back into the match having Easts 8-113 in the 35<sup>th</sup>. However, we narrowly went down by one run on the last ball of the day.









The final round match was against Ex-Services. After being sent in by Ex-Services we managed to score 175 before being bowled out. O'Sullivan (49), King (61) and Extras (20) were the top scorers on a fairly good batting track. Ex-Services were 3-63 after 33 overs when the heavens opened up. The match was consequently a washout resulting in the 'Grove taking the Minor Premiership. I think the guys deserved this having only lost 2 matches all year.

Unfortunately, there was a twist to this happy story. We didn't send a delegate to the last association meeting which was held on the Wednesday before the Final and consequently we lost 2 competition points. This gave Easts the Minor Premiership by one point and meant we had to play Ex-Services in the semi final. In hard fought match we scored 171 with Schaef top scoring (36) while Farmer (30) & Chapman (18) also contributed. After a flying start Ex-Services looked to be in control at 3-73. They then lost their way to be all out for 155 thanks to some good bowling and fielding. Finally, we got another shot at Easts in the Grand Final.

With a late start to the match due to a wet wicket, Easts won the toss and elected to bat on what looked to be a juicy wicket. After some great bowling, Curry (11 overs for 12 runs) & Woody (4-21 off 14), Easts were 2-71 at the end of the first days play with 39 overs bowled. After batting their remaining overs the next day (31), Easts finished with 8-160. A disastrous start saw Easts on top of the mighty 'Grove with us reeling at 3-24. Soon after we had recovered to be were 4-59 and were getting back into the match. However, once again the heavens opened up and the game was declared a washout. This meant the 'Grove were declared joint premiers with Easts and we'd won back to back premierships.

I would like to thank all the players that played in 1<sup>st</sup> grade throughout the year and Harry & Warwick Browne for their efforts at training. I am looking forward to the new season starting. Having watched a few games in the lower grades this year, HCCC is looking very good for the years ahead. I would also like to thank the committee for their tireless effort through the season.







# 2001/2 Stubby Cup Challenge Hillgrove XI v's Wauchope XI

The 4<sup>th</sup> annual Stubby Cup Challenge was held on the 13<sup>th</sup> of April 2002 with the Hillgrove XI travelling to Wauchope to do battle on the infamous "Pitch in the Paddock".

Hillgrove XI captain Newbs won the toss and elected to field, deciding the cool of the morning may be a bit more bearable to field in than the searing afternoon heat.

With Hillgrove in the field, Jason Blythe & ex-Grover Ben Churcher faced up to the Hillgrove new ball pairing of Jared Parsons & Christian Duff. It is fair to say Wauchope had the better of the first stanza with the score after 8 overs at 0/63. Jared bowled very unluckily to return figures of 0/31 while Duff demonstrated that he should have stuck to medium pace conceding 29 runs with his leggies, including 13 off his first over.

After the indifferent start, Hillgrove XI captain Newbs turned to his two strike weapons in Byrne & Curry to stem the flow of runs. Cuz repaid his captain's faith grabbing a wicket in his 1st over while Byrne showed that he may have been the most under bowled bloke in the club grabbing wickets with his 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> balls. Wauchope had slumped from 0/70 to 3/73 and with Cuz grabbing the prize wicket of ex teammate Ben Churcher in the next over, Wauchope were in trouble at 4/74.

A moment of controversy then struck the Stubby Challenge Cup when Wauchope batsmen Tony Broderick was adjudged LBW for a duck only to be sportingly called back to the crease by the Hillgrove vice captain Brad King. This was a decision Hillgrove soon began to rue with Broderick showing no mercy, smashing sixes to all parts of the ground. The Sewell brothers were unlucky enough to be bowling at the time and were the recipients of most of the onslaught. Nick started well taking a wicket with his first ball and ended up with 1-42 off his 4 overs while Sam was unlucky and finished with 0-40. It should be noted that Nick did bowl courageously after sustaining an injury that he later described as "needing that female touch".

Wok & Kingy then came into the attack and tried to tame the Wauchope batting lineup. Both bowled tightly returning figures of 2/24 & 1/12 respectively of their 4 overs with Wok bowling Broderick for 89 much to the relief of the Hillgrove fieldsmen who were getting tired of fetching the ball out of the paddock. Nonetheless Wauchope had compiled a formidable 8/226 after just 32 overs with 12 overs still to bowl.

Bernard Browne, Ray Mathews & Newbs then came into the attack hoping to wrap up the tail cheaply. Bernard continued on his brother's good work to finish with 2/15 including the wicket of Jason Bradshaw who it could be said was quite "browned" off after being caught behind by Wok. Razor & Newbs then "rounded" out the attack with Newbs very excited at claiming his first wicket. Wauchope ended up with 12/260 off 41.2 overs and although Wauchope didn't bat out their overs, the Hillgrove batsmen knew they had a

big task in front of them if they were to keep their unbeaten Stubby Cup Challenge record intact.

After a traditional "Pitch in the Paddock" barbeque, Sewelly & Byrne strode to the crease to take up the run chase. A solid opening stand of 28 was on the board when Sewelly edged one to the keeper off the bowling of Churcher in the 7<sup>th</sup> over. Wok then joined Byrne at the crease and they put on a partnership of 51 before Byrne was stumped by Newb's son in law, Jacob White, in the 18<sup>th</sup> over. Hillgrove then suffered a bit of a middle order collapse with Duff having his stumps well and truly disturbed by Peter Barron for 7 and Newbs being dismissed in similar fashion by Jason Blythe for 2. This left Hillgrove at 4-111 still requiring 150 to win off 20 overs. Despite the imposing run rate of 7.5/over, some hope was still held with Wok & Kingy at the crease and the now rather "happy" Wauchope bowling attack.

Wok & Kingy kept the run rate poking along nicely with Wok bringing up a well earned half century before edging one to the keeper to be on his way for 54. Sam Sewell took up where Wok left off and things were looking slightly more promising for the Hillgrove team. However, Kingy then suffered a slice of misfortune when he hit one in the air to the only fieldsman on the ground who hadn't been indulging in a quiet ale and was out for a quick fire 23.

Unfortunately this sparked somewhat of a lower order collapse with Bernard Browne (3), Razor (4), Jared (1) & Cuz (9) all falling cheaply to leave Hillgrove in trouble at 10/179 in the 37<sup>th</sup> over. With 62 still required for victory off just 7 overs, Newbs strode back out to the middle hoping to improve on his earlier innings. After dispatching his first scoring shot for 6, Newbs then combined with Sam Sewell in a last attempt to get Hillgrove back into the game. The two batted well and with one over remaining, Hillgrove needed just 33 to win.

Things weren't to be however with Hillgrove finishing at 10/234, 26 runs shy of the target with Newbs & Sam unbeaten on 34 & 37 respectively. Wauchope had ended the Grove's winning streak and were deserved winners of their first Stubby Cup Challenge.

Special thanks should go to Tom Lamont and the Wauchope team for their hospitality and the good spirit in which the game was played. We look forward to hosting the Wauchope boys in Armidale this year and trying to win back the "Stubby Cup".

### My 6 months in England






